They say that the difference between an **extrovert** and an **introvert** is what happens when they are away from people: Introverts are energized by time alone, while extroverts are drained by isolation.

- Would you consider yourself an introvert or an extrovert?
- How much “alone time” is good for you, before you start going crazy?
- What is your best, one-sentence definition of the **Trinity**?
- What are some common **questions** or **objections** people have to this doctrine?
- What is your best **explanation** for what the Trinity is like?

The Trinity is a part of the nature of God that was progressively unveiled in the Bible over time. On Sunday Morning, Pastor Mike said that from the very beginning there were clues and hints in the **Old Testament** as to something extraordinary in God's nature that was pointing toward the Trinity.

- Can you remember what any of those early clues were?
- What **other biblical evidence** would you give for the Trinity?

Read I John 4:7-8

This verse says that “**God is love.**”

- What are some watered-down things that this does NOT mean?
- Why is the Trinity necessary for this to really be true about God?

As we begin to explore what it means to build loving, spiritually-significant **community** – why is it important to understand first how the Trinity is a part of God's inherent nature?

How has our COVID world caused you to think about the importance of significant relationships? Has this been an encouraging season of community for you or more discouraging? Why?

What are you hoping to experience in these next 7 weeks of COMMUNITY together?
