## Small Group Questions & Personal Study

What was your **most inspiring experience** of being a part of a team, group, or committed relationship with a common cause? Talk about it, and what made it so great to be a part of it.

What do you think most people think of today when they hear the word “**fellowship**”? What did that English word originally mean?

Review the biblical definition that Pastor Mike gave for fellowship (“**koinonia**”) in Sunday’s message? What do you see as the key parts of that definition?

### Read I John 1:1-7

According to these verses, who are we in fellowship with?

As far as our fellowship with God – what do we get out of this partnership? (See also Philippians 1:7, I Peter 5:1, Jude 3)

What does God get out of His end of the partnership?

How committed is God to us in this partnership?

(See also John 10:28-30, Romans 8:38-39)

What would John say to someone who says that they are deeply committed to their partnership with God, but not so much to other Christians?

On Sunday morning, Pastor Mike said that true fellowship means a commitment to a common purpose. Either from Philippians chapter 1, or elsewhere – how would you define what that purpose is?

In this group, what could we DO to be more focused together on that PURPOSE?
